Ownership of Copyright: As the Author of the Work submitted to AER, you are the original owner of the copyright, and the Work is protected under provisions of the U.S. Copyright Act. As the author, you may register the copyright, manage copyright rights and reprint requests, and pursuing infringement questions that may arise.

Rights Assigned to the Astronomy Education Review and its publisher, the Association of Universities for Research in Astronomy, Inc. (AURA): The *Astronomy Education Review* is a nonprofit publication of a nonprofit corporation dedicated to sharing information with the widest possible educational audience. The *Astronomy Education Review's* policy is to encourage our authors and readers to copy and make productive use for nonprofit purposes of works published. While you retain the copyright and other literary rights to the article submitted, you assign to the *Astronomy Education Review* a nonexclusive right to the copyright, including, but not limited to, publication rights as described below:

Copyright Assignment:

Such requests made to the *Astronomy Education Review* will be referred to the author.

Provided that the copyright header attached to the Work is retained and provided that the content is not modified, individuals and libraries may:

- Download, save, and print the Work for personal use.
- Store the Work for reserve use in either paper or electronic form.
- Download, print, and distribute the Work in multiple copies for classroom use as long as they are not sold for this or other commercial purposes.
